MEP/LULAC High School Hispanic Recruitment & SHPE NILA Conference

*October 23, 2003

Eight UMR Society of Hispanic Professional Engineer students visited three high schools in the Kansas City, MO area in an effort to recruit Hispanic students to UMR. They met with over 100 students. These students were invited to attend a 2-day camp in November.
